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

Linking Theory to Caring Practice and Practice to Caring Theory



Dr. Arne Rehnsfeldt is a Swedish registered nurse and doctor in health sciences at Åbo Akademi University in Finland which has caring science as the main discipline. He is also a professor emeritus in nursing science at Western Norway University of Applied Sciences where he served for the last 11 years. As a professor emeritus, Dr. Rehnsfeldt continues his work to develop clinical caring science as a scientific discipline and teach caring and caring science, in the heritage of Professor Katie Eriksson.

Dr. Rhensfeldt's areas of research include caring in life decisive circumstances in context of disasters and dignity in elderly care. He has published three books in Swedish and many peer reviewed book chapters and international scientific articles.

Lena Wiklund Gustin

Integrating Caring Science Theory with Practical Skills Training in Nursing Education



Dr. Lena Wiklund Gustin is a registered nurse with specialization in psychiatric and mental health care. She has also a license in cognitive psychotherapy as well as a MSc in CBT and supervision. Her main focus in practice as well as research and education is Caring Science. She has a PhD in Caring Science from Åbo Academy University in Finland and has also undergone the Caritas Coach Education at Watson Caring Science Institute. She is currently working as a professor in nursing at UIT/The arctic university of Norway, and at Mälardalen University in Sweden where she is responsible for the specialist education in psychiatric and mental health nursing care.

Caring Science, Mindful Practice

Kathleen Sitzman, PhD, RN, CNE, ANEF, FAAN, Distinguished Watson Caring Science Sch



This course provides tools for caring professionals to enhance professional care practices in everyday work environments. Learners will be introduced to Watson's Caring Science. Exploration and learning related to key concepts will be supported through the introduction of mindfulness practice, reflective narrative, and contemplative art. Asynchronous discussion, moderated by a team of educators knowledgeable in Caring Science will provide a forum for ongoing

Interaction and discovery among participants during each 4-week class session. Certificates of completion will be earned by participants who complete the course learning modules.

There are no required "meeting" times for this course. Each participant is asked to follow the course calendar in terms of due dates but otherwise participants may log in and review the materials each week when they can fit it into their schedule. They are also asked to participate in asynchronous discussion boards during the time blocks indicated on the course calendar but there are no specific meeting times due to the broad range of time zones that students in the course typically come from. There is a lot of asynchronous interaction between course instructors and participants, people from all over the world share their thoughts about caring in their lives and work. I hope you and your colleagues will join us.
