DESCRIPTION:

Caring Science acknowledges the interconnectedness of the universe and teaches nurses to behave in harmony with not only their patients but also their surroundings, assuming a unitary worldview instead of one of separation (Watson Caring Institute, 2017). Without the value of caring, nurses cannot demonstrate the full capacity of their task to perform holistic care for their patients. It takes passion and determination to fully understand the true value of caring.

My artwork is a personification of my personal experience in the Intensive Care Unit. It was a feeling, a moment that I will never forget. An experience that forever changed my perspective on the different aspects of caring, on how we should value life – to transcend to the highest form of empathy – the art of caring. It was an untold memoir, a reverence towards my dying patient. The artwork shows how I struggled, and how I was determined to save a life. Vividly, I can remember how life slipped away from her, how the four of us managed to transport her back to the ICU from the dialysis unit. The photo painted thousands of meanings, but in the end, the experience taught me well how caring is the root of every patient's healing. A future, for caring science to be the center of the nursing profession.

REFLECTIVE CARING PRAXIS: STRENGTHENING OUR INNER COMPASS

Dr. Sara Horton-Deutsch, PhD, PMHCNS, RN, FAAN, ANEF, GAHN, Caritas Coach & Scholar

Professor and Director of University of San Francisco/Kaiser Permanente Partnership Watson Caring Science Faculty Associate and Director of the Caritas Leadership Program

Dr. Horton-Deutsch has led in academic and practice settings for 35 years as an advanced practice psychiatric/mental health nurse, teacher/practitioner, consultant, program director, caring science endowed chair, coach, and academic/practice partnership director. In 2022, she was inducted into the Global American Holistic Nursing. Through her academic and practice career, she has contributed to evidence and practice-based knowledge development to ensure safety and quality care. As a reflective leader, she focuses on being inwardly sound and other focused to influence change positively. She has coauthored a number of books on Reflective Practice, Caring Science, and Caritas Coaching. She is a Caritas Coach, HeartMath Trainer, Reiki Practitioner, and Healing Circle Facilitator. Through her journey, she has learned the necessity of connecting to one's own inner sources of wisdom, power, and healing, as well as the arts and humanities that once defined the discipline of nursing. She is passionate about facilitating critical, deep, and authentic connections that support resilience and the profession's evolution. She has a new book; Visionary Leadership in Healthcare being published this month through SIGMA. She is currently on the Board of Directors of SIGMA and Co-Director of the Caritas Leadership Program for the Watson Caring Science Institute.



CARING AND IMPLEMENTATION SCIENCE: BUILDING A BRIDGE TO SUSTAINABILITY

Tricia Thomas PhD, RN, FAAN

Dean & Professor Kirkhof College of Nursing, Grand Valley State University

Dr. Tricia Thomas is Dean & Professor in the Kirkhof College of Nursing at Grand Valley State University in Grand Rapids, Michigan. She serves as the Chair of the Nursing Academy in the National Academies of Practice (NAP), comprised of 14 disciplines dedicated to interprofessional practice and education. Over the last 2 decades she has focused on building innovative interprofessional teams and academic-practice partnerships to transform care by building consensus and shared purpose to achieve workforce, clinical, and financial outcomes. Holding leadership roles spanning service operations and academe, academic practice partnerships have been essential elements for innovative and responsive care delivery design. Her strategic framework emphasizes the centrality of nursing to organizational effectiveness with four domains: nurse role optimization; caring ways; leadership sustainability; and care access, quality, and safety. Her engagement in caring science was instrumental in providing a structure to discuss, describe, and act upon strengths and challenges in the profession. Compelled by the rapid, complex, and persistent change, she has engaged nurses locally, nationally, and internationally to explore their nursing identity through the lens of caring theory and examine the social and technical attributes that enable or impede work measuring constructs related to job satisfaction for actionable focus.

Dr. Thomas has been recognized by ANA Michigan for leadership and mentorship with the Dorothea Milbrandt Nurse Leader award and by the American Association of Colleges of Nursing for the pioneering work to develop the Clinical Nurse Leader role with the Nurse Educator Vanguard Award acknowledging her impact at the organization, local, state, national, and international levels. She has authored recognized textbooks in nursing leadership, quality and safety, and project management and has engaged in dissemination through presentations, publications, and national and international consultation. Recently she published a textbook, Implementation Science: A Framework for Nursing Education and Practice, to engage educators and practitioners in implementation science as the vehicle for theory guided uptake of evidence-based practices, innovation, and sustainable change.

Dr. Thomas holds national board certification in Advanced Nursing Administration, Adult Health, Healthcare Management, and as a Clinical Nurse Leader. She is a Fellow in the American Academy of Nursing and a Distinguished Fellow in the National Academies of Practice. She also serves as an American Nurses Credentialing Center Magnet appraiser and a Commission on Collegiate Nursing Education visitor.


